Building Math Confidence Fosters Success

As their teacher, you are one of the prime influences on your students and you can help them to revamp their attitudes to help them to become successful Math learners! This workshop will offer strategies to reduce Math anxiety in students.

We will discuss how to focus on individual needs and how to use hands-on tools to strengthen <u>Basic Skills</u>. Strategies presented are designed to build student confidence, helping students to be more engaged and successful in Math.
