Saturday September 12th

CREATING A COMMUNITY OF LEARNING AND CARE FOR K-3 TEACHERS With Tamara Sengotta

I use your classroom space to its best advantage

Deb will share practical ideas that contribute to a meaningful, purposeful and engaging literacy program. The role of purposeful play in meeting the needs of all students in a comprehensive literacy program will also be explored. Participants will leave with lots of ideas to engage learners all year long!

Saturday September 26th

Building a Responsive Curriculum for K-3 Teachers (AM Session) With Harpreet Esmail and Shannon Bain

To begin inquiry-based learning and pedagogical documentation, invitations for learning can be set out by the educator to provoke the students for further exploration and investigation. In this session, we will explore how to use learning invitations and pedagogical documentation to plan next steps for a potential inquiry. We will also look at ways to build a responsive curriculum – that responds to students' interests – while also meeting the requirements outlined in BC's new transformative curriculum.

Math Games and Invitations: Engaging and Activating Mathematical Thinking Through Play for K-3 Teachers (PM Session) With Andrea MacInnes

Explore ways to make math learning fun for all students. With easy to gather materials, create an engaging learning experience that encompasses number, pattern, shape and probability.

Saturday October 3rd

DPA and Physical Education: Tips, Tricks, Games and Fun for K-3 (AM Session) With Tammy Wirick

In this session, Tammy will provide you with all the tools you need to make DPA a fun and memorable part of your daily schedule. She will also teach you age appropriate games for PE.

Both have completed their Masters degree from Simon Fraser University with focuses on self-regulation and supporting the whole child through inquiry-based learning. Together, Shannon and Harpreet have co-facilitated workshops on play-based learning, inquiry-based learning, social and emotional learning, and the Reggio-Emilia approach. In addition, both Shannon and Harpreet have worked as sessional instructors at SFU, teaching the course: Integrating Assessment, Planning and Practice.
